GO LOCAL IN EVERY WAY POSSIBLE

A study conducted in Austin showed that \$45 of every \$100 spent at a local bookstore stayed in the community whereas only \$13 of every \$100 spent at a Wall Street owned bookstore stayed in the community. - 3. Form Community Investment Block Parties** –You can start one yourself. The goal of groups like these is to strengthen the local economy. The possibilities are as limitless as the imaginations of the people in the Third District.
